LARGE COIN THEFT SUSPECTS ARRESTED AND LARGE QUANTITY OF COINS RECOVERED







Towns County Sheriff's Office received information from a McConnell Memorial Baptist Church member that Ms. Nancy Kelly, an elderly Towns County resident, was being exploited by a handy man, Christopher James Plush and his accomplice, Devin Barry Lowery.

Sheriff's Office Investigators opened a criminal investigation and found there were missing prescription drugs, a handgun, several hundred rare coins and a large amount of cash. Her vehicle was also stolen, wrecked and damaged.

Sheriff's Investigators worked around the clock to locate the suspects and arrest them. They also worked very quickly to recover cash, the handgun, prescription drugs and hundreds of the rare coins with an estimated value in the thousands.

The victim and her husband, who is deceased, had collected valuable rare coins for years. One rare coin has an estimated value of \$23,000. There is no way to estimate the value of the coins without an expert.

Sheriff Ken Henderson stated that elderly citizens are easy targets for fraud and theft. Sheriff Henderson wants to thank the concerned citizen for the information that led to the investigation and arrests in this matter. The quick work in locating the suspect and his accomplice led to the recovery of stolen property, which will be returned to the victim.

Christopher James Plush, age 30, Homeless, was arrested and charged with one (1) count of burglary and three (3) counts of theft by taking.

Plush's accomplice, Devin Barry Lowery, age 24, of Ducktown, TN was also arrested and charged with one (1) count of burglary and one (1) count of theft by taking.




All persons are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Winter safety tips for our elderly citizens

Elderly Towns County Residents are encouraged to have an emergency plan and kit that will allow them to remain in place for at least three days if they are unable to safely leave their homes.

The plan and kit should include:

- A battery-operated radio, flashlight, and extra batteries for both of those items.
- Food you can open and prepare easily without electricity.
- One gallon of water per person, per day.
- A first-aid kit and backup supply of medications.
- Spare glasses, extra hearing aid batteries, and non-powered alternatives to assistive and medical equipment that may not work without electricity.
- A loud horn, whistle, or bell you can use to help first responders locate you.
- The names and phone numbers of people you can call for help if you need it.
- A plan for where you will go if it is unsafe to remain in your home, and how you will get there.
